Our School Goals

- To use inferencing to determine the author's message in books representative of diverse student voice in both fiction and non-fiction texts
- To provide descriptive feedback based on learning goals and success criteria so students can set personal goals
- To develop procedural fluency and automaticity for basic facts and operations using a variety of representations (e.g. splitting strategies)

Self-Assessment Results and Action Plan - November 2019

- Results have been posted on the board upstairs
- Students were asked "How does inferencing help you as a reader? Do you have a specific example related to a text you have read?"
- A graph was shown indicating students who "got it", "almost got it" and "not quite"
- Results indicate that the students need more support in this area

• Next steps:

- Classes to discuss what is the difference between a prediction and an inference anchor chart (inference versus prediction) will be given to each class;
- Specific questions will be asked of students; Sentence Frames connect your guess to the text (go deeper) – based on evidence, schema and background knowledge (each teacher will receive a copy of these sentence frames/questions to ask students);
- Teachers are encouraged to use texts (more than one day) 3-5 days or longer (building upon understanding each day) 5-day shared reading plan whole class shared reading

 attitude towards mental illness, encourages mental health promotion, provides links to
 community resources, and provides an opportunity for students to learn from trained support
 speakers with lived experiences of mental illness, mental health and recover. This is a 5 day, inclass program
- Mental Health First Aid a few staff are also trained in this

STAFF LIASIONS' REPORT - Sarah Mitchell

- Teachers have asked whether they would be receiving "Teacher Allotments" as in previous years
- Teachers have also asked whether the SCC can support Scientist in the School this year
- Due to very low funds in the account, the SCC cannot commit to offering Teacher Allotments or Scientist in the School at this time
- Discussion with regards to Scientist in the School feedback is that some students like it and others (especially Intermediate) find the programming repetitive; it may be more suitable for younger grades; programming is old and needs modernization
- Suggestions 1) Use the STEM carts; 2) Utilize the "Free" STEM program offered through
 Ontario Tech; 3) In future, allocate funds to each class and the class can decide how the funds
 could be utilized for Science programming

NEW BUSINESS

Work to Rule

- As of Monday, January 13th, teachers will no longer be booking or offering school trips; extracurricular activities are expected to stop
- As of Monday January 20th, there will be rotating strikes

SCC Meetings

- Discussed option of having daytime meetings to increase attendance
- Some members who come in the evening are not available during the day
- The option of a webcast was also discussed as a possibility in future

The Pit

- The Pit is a mess and requires organization and de-cluttering
- SCC members went in this week and organized some of the bins/supplies
- Items unaccounted for will be discarded

Sports Activities

- Gym is open at lunch hours for activities
- Basketball practices are occurring after-school but may soon end due to "Work to Rule"
- The trip to Ontario Tech to watch Basketball is scheduled for January 13th but may not occur due to "Work to Rule"

Welcome Package

- Nicole suggested providing new students with a "Welcome Package", including information and brochures etc. related to the school and community
- Attendees agreed this was a great idea and supported the creation of these packages

The Lion King

- Ms. Cameron indicated that plans are well underway for the Musical "The Lion King" to be held in April 2020
- Auditions have occurred, students have their scripts and plans for costumes and set are occurring
- Students are eager to be involved and practices can occur during the lunch hour
- If "Work to Rule" continues, shows may have to occur during the day; rather than the evening
- Parents are welcome to help out with set design
- Ms. Cameron is unable to collect money SCC members offered to assist with ticket sales if necessary

Graduation

- Ms. Mandal indicated that Eastdale has been booked on June 23, 2020 for grade 8 grad; she will ask Mr. Hercia to book the high school students to assist with sound/DJ'ing
- A committee has been formed with a few grade 7 and a few grade 8 parents
- Due to specialized food requirements, food costs are higher; it has been decided there will be snacks/treats provided to graduates and not a main course (e.g. pizza) as in previous years
- Discussion with regards to the cost of cupcakes that need to be dairy-free; option of a slab cake was also discussed; Frantastics, M & R (Whitby) and/or Aunt Audrey's may be able to offer dairy-free options; committee encouraged to investigate costs
- A suggestion was made for SCC to give less than \$2000.00 towards graduation this year due to lower funds in budget and fewer students in the graduating class; discussion occurred that food costs are higher this year due to dairy-free requirements
- Discussion occurred that last year the grad committee was well under \$2000 budget, however \$2000 was expensed from the account; a breakdown of 2019 costs is currently unknown

Graduation Trip

- Mr. Bedford indicated a graduation trip was not booked by the school and nothing has been planned for the Grade 8's
- Currently due to the labour disruption, teachers cannot book trips and as of January 13th field
 trips are no longer occurring unless the contract is settled; the Board is not approving any trips
 until the unions have settled; it would also be too difficult to refund parents' money had a trip
 been booked and does not occur
- Janice expressed disappointment with regards to the lack of planning for the Grade 8 students;
 these are the same students who did not have a Ganaraska trip in Grade 6
- Mr. Bedford has agreed to make the grad trip/party a priority once the labour disruption ends

Dance-A-Thon

- Janice agreed to organize Dance-A-Thon; Nicole has offered to assist Janice with the event
- Event will occur on Thursday, April 9, 2020
- Discussed that in the past Mr. Petrarca ran the Dance portion and a Supply Teacher would be required if this were to happen again this year
- Ms. Mandal co-ordinates the time classes go to the gym to dance
- Suggestion feedback was received from teachers last year that they would prefer if classes doubled-up so students could attend the dance for a double period; they could have more opportunity to both eat food and dance (last year some students did not dance much as they spent most of the time eating)
- Discussion regarding ability to sell popcorn Nicole said she has found a topping that is "dairy-free"; machine can be cleaned out and can be considered "safe" to sell popcorn at event
